The basic word order is subject-verb-object, but sentences may be restructured so as to be topic-prominent. Vietnamese is otherwise largely head-initial, has a noun classifier system, is pro-drop, wh-in-situ, and allows verb serialization.

subject in almost every sentence, but Vietnamese grammar has no dummy subject and makes considerably less use of pronouns.

Studying Vietnamese grammar is very important because it is the backbone of the language. Without it, you will be limited to what expressions you can use. Students learning Vietnamese grammar are better able to understand how the combination of words can create intricate meanings and how these can create subtle literary effects.

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The grammar in the Vietnamese language is heavily reliant upon the word order and sentence structure in order to convey the proper meaning. In fact, this is important than having word changes through the inflection of tone used, or morphology. Many languages use morphology to determine and express a tense, but that is not the case with Vietnamese.
